As mentioned in our email earlier this week, PLEASE DO NOT SEND YOUR CHILD INTO SCHOOL UNLESS A TEACHER IS OUT FRONT WHEN DROPPING OFF! Escorting your child down is a courtesy we provide so parents don't have to leave their cars each day, and we try very hard to be out front 5 mins prior to the start of class. However, some days set up takes a bit longer, and we dash up there as soon as we can! But our doors are locked until then because we are unable to supervise your child. It is unsafe to drop off children under these circumstances. (Of course, conversely, if you are LATE to preschool we will all have already come down to school, and in that instance you will absolutely need to bring down your child yourself.) Thank you for your understanding and cooperation in helping keep all our students safe!

We try to go outside on any day that is even remotely dry and not too windy. But temperatures have dropped significantly since the beginning of the year, so please make sure your child is dressed for the weather with a jacket /sweater and something covering those bare legs!

And speaking of wardrobe issues, we appreciate you sending your child in shoes they can put on themselves. Could you do us a big favor, though, and take a few minutes to practice this with your child? We are still seeing quite a few children struggling with even their slip-on shoes, or refusing to even try by themselves. This one little thing takes SO much time away from learning and play time each day, so we would be grateful for any small amount of time you could work on this with your child. Thank
